## QUESTIONS

Remember this is a dialogue, not a quiz. The questions are a good start to draw out observations about the story, and the "answers" are just there to help you guide kids toward some key ideas.

- 1. Why did God tell the Israelites to drive out everyone who lived in Canaan? What happened?
- 2. What is the pattern the Israelites got into?
- 3. What was the role of the prophets? What did the prophets foretell about the Messiah?

From all of the stories so far...

- 4. What have you seen for the first time in these stories?
- 5. What common themes run through all the stories?
  - God wants us to live closely with Him—listening and obeying.
  - He provides the best possible way of life for us to live.
  - God wants to rescue His creation and bring them back to Himself.
    He will go to amazing lengths to accomplish this.
  - Our sins require sacrifice—a life for a life.
- 6. What have we learned about what humans are like? Where have we seen that?
